Greeting from Baron's

Card Shop Stays in Touch with Traditions and Trends

In the 70s it was incense and posters. Today it's Crocs and Silly Banz. But, no matter what the current craze, there is one thing you always are assured of getting at Baron's Hallmark Shop in Hackettstown – and that is the right greeting card for any occasion.

Norman Baron started out in 1972 with a card store in the Hackettstown Mall and expanded to his current and now only location in the Shop Rite Plaza on Route 57. Although he has seen many fads come and go, cards, gift wrap and candy remain the “basics” of his business.

“Cards are the key element and make up one third of the business,” Baron said, noting that stationery, gift wrap and albums account for approximately 20 percent and the other 50 percent of business is in giftware.

The rapidly escalating price of paper in conjunction with the advent of electronic greeting cards have had an impact on business, although Baron said there are limitations on what's is appropriate to send over the Internet.

“You can get away with birthday cards,” he said, adding that for anniversary cards it may not be such a good idea.

He noted that many people still see the value in a paper card, citing a new Hallmark advertising campaign that pictures a mother looking back over the cards she has received from her children over the years.

On the other hand, technology has been a boon to the business with the introduction of cards that play music, talk and record messages, which Baron said are generating a lot of interest.

Selection and service remain the best defenses against competition, according to Baron, who said that people come to his store because of the wide assortment of cards and gifts as well as the friendly and personal service.

It's Tee Time

Infini-Tee Golf Center is in Full-Swing All Year Round

How's your golf game looking these days? Do you need to fix that slice, improve your swing, perfect that putt? Or are you picking up a golf club for the first time? Whatever your golfing needs, you can find it at Infini-Tee Golf Center - without even having to check the weather forecast first.

The 23,000 square foot indoor golf center, located on Stockton Street in Phillipsburg features a 1,300 square foot putting green, more than 4,000 square feet of short game practice areas, and an 18-hole miniature golf course.

High-tech simulators provide golfers with feedback on their shots including total distance and backspin. The system reproduces actual golf course conditions such as wind and water and sand hazards in a variety of courses from the famous Pebble Beach in California to the Nine Dragons Resort and Golf Course in Zhejiang, China. All sessions are recorded so players can review their performance multiple times.

"It is perfect practice," said Charlie Braxmeier, co-owner of Infini-Tee. "You can learn the exact distance the ball travels and have the wind blowing exactly the same in every shot."

Skylands Music & Arts Festival Moves to Blirstown

This year's Skylands Music & Arts Festival will be held at Sycamore Park just off of Route 94 in Blirstown the weekend of August 20-22, 2010.

"We are very excited about coming to Blirstown," said Event Coordinator Mark Clifford. "The new location offers not only a naturally beautiful setting but the opportunity to grow in ways that we couldn't before due to space constraints."

The Recreation Department and area non-profit organizations are hoping that the festival will also be a chance for them to raise money for their causes while also enjoying great music.

"You can expect only the best in music," declared Clifford. "This is truly Northwest New Jersey's largest family-oriented music festival and it will cover the gamut, from rock to blues to bluegrass and everything in between."

Acts include The Subdudes, The Alternate Routes and Swampadelica, songwriters Vance Gilbert and Maia Sharp, and gypsy swing innovators Caravan of Thieves.

The festival's Vendor Village will provide a unique shopping experience and the International Foodway will present a diverse assortment of affordable foods and beverages.

Feedback also is available in human form. Infini-Tee employs the services of Keith Grassing, a full-time teaching professional and PGA golf professional Bruce Young who is available by appointment.

Amenities such as Ping N Flight Custom Club Fitting software enables seasoned players to get their own clubs evaluated or sets beginners up with the right fit. Infini-Tee is one of the only places in New Jersey that offers this service.

"People walk away with the clubs that they ought to be using," commented Braxmeier.

Infini-Tee has a variety of membership packages available that offers specials and discounts on all of the center's facilities. Members can even join an indoor league. Golf clinics are available for adults and children as well as summer camps for young golfers.

"The clinics take place rain or shine," Braxmeier said. "Participants use our technology and then we go out to a local golf course and let them play."

Braxmeier, who has been an avid golfer since his teens, partnered with Edward Leasure, who took up the sport after his retirement. They created Infini-Tee Golf Center in September of 2009 based on thorough market research.

"The idea has flourished in Canada and has done well in the western United States," commented Leasure, noting that Phillipsburg and the surrounding area showed potential for this type of facility.

Infini-Tee also features a conference room for business meetings and also can accommodate birthday parties. Braxmeier has been working with local restaurants and golf courses to help bring business into the area.

"We have a beginning customer base," he said. "And we will keep building."

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE



Tips for Meeting with Elected Officials

Meeting in person with your members of Congress, city council members or state legislator is the most effective way to get attention and present your arguments. It is easy to set up an appointment. Just call and ask to speak to the scheduler; state the nature of the proposed meeting; and agree on a date and time.

You can meet with members of Congress at local district offices during a congressional recess. Be well-prepared since the meetings generally last only 10 to 15 minutes. Here are some guidelines for a successful meeting

- Prepare a short statement of the issue and the result you would like to see.
- If there is legislation involved, provide the relevant bill number.
- Provide concrete examples of how the issue affects you, your business, and your employees.
- Cover only one issue, if possible.
- State clearly the action you want the official to take.
- Provide your business card or other contact information and obtain cards from staff attending the meeting.

Important: Always remember to write a thank-you letter and state that you will follow up at an appropriate time.

LearnDoEarn Addresses Future Workforce Concerns

The Learn More Now, Do More Now, Earn More Later Student Credentialing System can help employers build their future workforce, contribute to their community school system, and improve the quality of life for their employees. LearnDoEarn has programs that address employer challenges.

Red Tape Review Group Makes Recommendations

The Red Tape Review Group, chaired by Lt. Governor Kim Guadagno, made its initial report public. As you know, New Jersey has increasingly been less able to compete with other states when it comes to opening or maintaining a business, and creating or maintaining jobs. Employers who seek to bring jobs and economic growth to New Jersey have suggested that the extensive system of administrative rules and regulations promulgated by State agencies needs to be improved.

The Red Tape Review Group was tasked with reviewing certain regulations that are a burden on New Jersey's economy. The report details recommendations to repeal, rescind or amend any recommendations that unduly burden business. Some of those recommendations, which will undoubtedly help make New Jersey a less regulated and friendlier place to do business, include:

Improving and Expediting the Rulemaking Process. The testimony received by the Red Tape Review Group made clear that it is overly difficult for a State agency to alter a rule or proposal based upon reasonable and justifiable public comment. The "Administrative Procedure Act" should be revised to permit State agencies to adopt substantive changes to proposed rules based on public comment without needing to undergo the entire rule-making process anew, provided that an additional public comment period is provided to the altered rule taking effect.

Giving Entities the Ability to Combat Unfunded Mandates. Provide for new and expanded powers to combat unfunded mandates, including permitting the Council on Local Mandates to proactively seek out mandates, enlarging the number of groups who can bring complaints to the Council, and enlisting the assistance of the State's law schools to undertake a review of all mandates presently contained in the statutory law and administrative code.

Following "Common Sense Principles." State agencies should adopt the "Common Sense Principles" for rule-making.

Creating Consistent and Timely Review of Regulation and Rule Effectiveness. Establish a Red Tape Review Group to succeed the 90-day Red Tape Review Group.
